



## How it works

The 5-week course is for students currently studying their diploma or degree who need additional support/guidance or students who will be starting studies and need preparation to ensure they succeed.

You can select to study Academic English 2, 3 or 4 depending on the level of your future studies. Within each of the three levels you can elect to study 5 weeks in Module A or B or 10 weeks in A + B. Each module targets areas which will support you as you embark on your studies at college or university.

	Module A	Module B
ACADEMIC ENGLISH 2 For Diploma Students	Participate in a small group discussion on a current global issue.	Prepare and present an 8 – 10 minute seminar presentation.
	This task will require you to use academic texts to support your opinions.	You will research and present information in groups, using visual aids and conduct a 5-minute discussion after the presentation.
	Practise and complete an in-class essay discussing two sides of an issue.	Research a particular field using real academic research methods and prepare a written report on your findings.
	You will need to write a structured essay between 350 – 400 words on a global issue.	You will conduct your own research as the basis for your writing.
ACADEMIC ENGLISH 3 For Degree Students	Practice and complete an in-class discussion essay using four sources as support.	Prepare and present a 10 – 12 minute seminar presentation on your field of work or study.
	This will require you to evaluate the information you read and select your evidence carefully.	You will research a contemporary issue in your field of interest and prepare a presentation with visuals, as well as some discussion points for your audience to participate in a 5-minute seminar discussion.
	Participate in a collaborative speaking task with your classmates.	Practise and complete a research essay on the topic of sustainability.
	This task looks in detail at your ability to interact in a collaborative group discussion – the way you will need to at university and later in the work place.	You will need to research the topic and then write an academic essay in 1200 words.
ACADEMIC ENGLISH 4 For Degree Students	Prepare for an integrated exam, which requires a response to both spoken and written texts.	Prepare and present a 12 – 15 minute seminar presentation.
	You will learn how to focus on key ideas and critically evaluate information in writing.	You will learn how to present information clearly and succinctly, using visual aids, in addition to leading a 5-minute seminar discussion.
	Participate in a discussion that is based on two academic texts.	Prepare an extended research report, incorporating arguments and evidence from a wide range of sources.
	This tasks requires you to read critically, refer to key information and negotiate a discussion with others.	You will need to research the topic and then write an analytical report in 1500 words, presenting problems and possible solutions. You will also need to provide recommendations.
